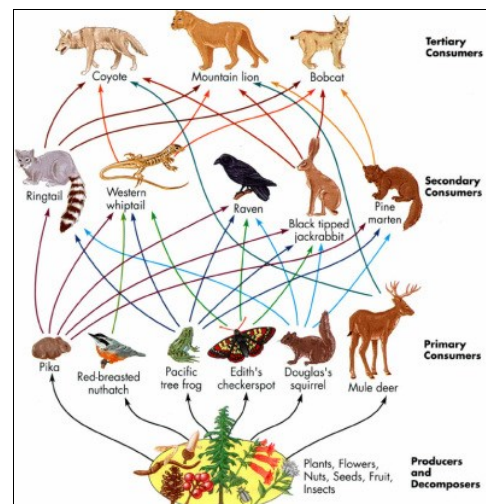

This half term our topic is:
Into the wild



We will be finding out about food chains, changing environments and classifying living things.

The library

Geography

Our Geography question is: **Where would you build a city?**

We will be:

- Looking at what makes a city and considering why cities are built certain ways and in certain places.
- The children will develop their geographical skills by looking at a variety of maps. They will need to consider how different places and aspects of a city are shown on a map.
- We will also be continuing to develop our geographical vocabulary when considering the different human and physical attributes of different places.

Literacy

We will be:

- Writing non-chronological reports texts linked to our science learning about the animals and their habitats.
- We will also be writing poetry and narrative texts based on the text Fox by Margaret Wild.

Numeracy

We will be learning about:

- Multiplication and division.
- Graphs and statistics
- Fractions



Science

Our Science question is: **Where do plants and animals thrive?**

We will be:

- Considering different habitats and why different animals and plants thrive in these places.
- Thinking about why animals and plants are suited to certain habitats and why.
- Discovering what kinds of animals and plants live within the local habitats around our school.
- Consider how environments change and why they change. Then consider how this impacts on the animals and plants that live there.
